<a href="#">A-B-C Summarize</a>	A-B-C Summarize is a form of review in which each student in a class is assigned a different letter of the alphabet and they must select a word starting...

<a href="#">Accommodations</a>	Techniques and materials that allow individuals with LD to complete school or work tasks with greater ease and effectiveness. Examples include spellcheckers,...
