

## **Disability.gov Launched: Connecting The Disability Community to Information & Opportunities**

The U.S. Department of Labor has launched [Disability.gov](#), a redesigned federal Web site that provides easy access to comprehensive disability-related information and resources. The site will connect the more than 50 million Americans with disabilities to thousands of reliable resources on disability related issues, programs and services. The site's Mission is to ensure that people with disabilities can fully participate in the workplace and in their communities.

Formerly known as DisabilityInfo.gov, the site has been completely redesigned. Easy to manage and navigate, it now includes new social media tools, such as a blog and a Twitter feed, to help encourage feedback and interaction among visitors.
